*Undergraduate Research in English Studies* is a groundbreaking collection that aims to mobilize the profession of English studies to further participate in undergraduate research.

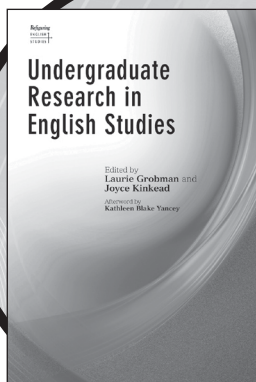
